Canton's "Secret Scorers"

hen the list of top scorers came out at a recent league meeting the names from Canton were blank. The missing names left some coaches to conclude that Canton was looking to hide their most effective players.

"Why aren't their names on that list?" one coach who wanted to remain anonymous, asked. "If I'm playing them I want to know who is putting the puck in the net."

League President, Paula Dumart, said that she too got complaints.

"We honored Canton's wish by not putting the names in," she said. "But when coaches came to me and complained that it hurt their strategy I thought they had a point." She said coaches can get the names from the scorekeeper or by asking Canton Coach, Mary

Beth Riley. However, she said the team requested that the names not be on the bulletin

board or printed in the SnapShot.

Riley said the omission of the names was not a strategy. In order for the team to be successful she said they have to include everybody, not just the highest scorers.

"We did it as a team thing versus an individual. We really didn't think it was such a big deal. The names are available at the scorer's booth. We're not trying to hide anything."

The scorekeeper said Canton requested that just the total points be printed and goals and assists be left out. "But we couldn't do that," she said, shrugging her shoulders in response to the entire episode.

However, Canton remains adamant that no strategy was involved. JoAnne Marrone, for example, is the team's highest scorer. "What are we going to do?" Riley asked, "Hide someone like JoAnne?"

She went on to say that there are times when her best players are those who aren't on the score sheet. "They may get no goals and no assists but they're the best player out there." Canton insist that they simply want those players to feel recognized.

Has omitting the names helped? Riley said she doesn't know. Asked if the team was going to omit the names again, Riley said the team hadn't talked about it but felt they probably weren't going to change anything.

However, for those who don't want to check with the scorekeeper while she is busy in her booth, or for Canton players who are secretly curious, Canton's top scorers are as follows:

JoAnne Marrone, 10 goals and 8 assists, S. White, 9 goals and 15 assists, Randy Brooks, 4 goals and 11 assists, and Cheryl Titcomb with 7 goals and 7 assists.

oaches often find themselves in "catch 22" situations, like the one Mary Beth Riley recently found herself in. (See front page story.) So how does Riley, who

used to wear number 22 as a player, like the transition from player to coach?

"I miss playing a little," she said. "But my father was a coach and my brothers coach." When former Canton Coach Paula Dumart left Canton to spend more time watching her son play in college Riley saw the opening as a way to continue her family tradition.

Riley said it hasn't been difficult to go from fellow player to coach. "We've played together for a long time. They know how I am and my philosophies." As a result she said getting the team's respect has not been difficult.

As for practices she said you can't do the things you do on the college level because players cannot come every week. "We do this for fun," she said of the team many see as the most serious in the league. Yet Canton does work hard on their drills. "I get the most satisfaction when I see something we've practiced work in a game," Riley said. She feels that the South Shore offers some of the best hockey around. "We may be the strongest league in the country." Riley sighted the national team members on Hobomock and Assabet A. She also pointed to the great former college players on Needham and the fantastic skills on Nighthawks A.

As for Canton they may go to Canada or investigate the rumors of a Marlboro tournament. "The only problem with going to Canada is you end up playing the teams from our league." That may be because, as Riley says, the skill level of the South Shore teams inevitably leads them to the final rounds.
